



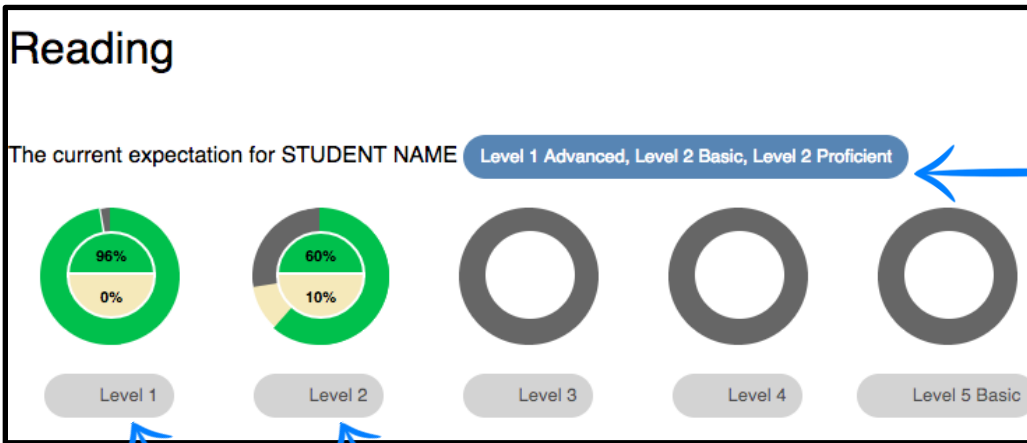
Understanding your child's Digital Report on LINC-ED

On the “Home Page” of your child’s digital report, you will see curriculum expectations and dials for Reading, Writing and Maths. Dials represent progress through each curriculum level according to learning goals for each level:

Green = goals achieved

Buff = goals set by the teacher to prioritise working on

Black = goals yet to be started or not yet evidenced

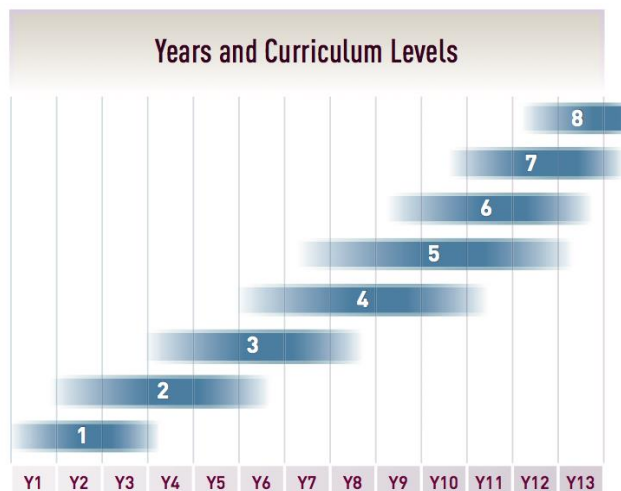


Curriculum level expectation related to how long the child has been at school.

The New Zealand Curriculum Levels

The chart below is from the New Zealand Curriculum. It shows how curriculum levels typically relate to years at a school. In their time at St Joseph’s (Year One to Year Eight), students cover curriculum Levels 1-4. **You can see that a curriculum level usually takes at least 2 years of learning.** Learning is a complex process of mastering and applying skills and knowledge, so consolidation and breadth of experiences are required at every curriculum level.



CURRICULUM EXPECTATIONS Years 1-8

Because a curriculum level covers around two years of learning, we think of it as divided into three sections:

Basic (the first third of the level 0-33%)

eg: Level 2 Basic = 2B

Proficient (the middle third of the level 33%-66%)

eg: Level 2 Proficient = 2P

Advanced (the final third of the level 67%-100%)

eg: Level 2 Advanced = 2A

The table below shows where we expect most children to be working in relation to their Year at school.
